

- Amazing professor! I really enjoyed the readings for this class! I thought that they were informative while not being too boring. My one complaint, however, is that there were a lot of readings to do for each week, but because this is a summer course, the workload is somewhat expected to be a little more heavy than during a regular quarter. Overall, loved the class
- Dr, Guzman is probably one of the most caring professors I've ever have. His classes are very interesting and he provides different materials to keep it interactive. Even though this course was online due to COVID 19, I felt very emgaged with it because the professor was too. This was my first class at UCLA and I could have not asked for better. It was a pleasant learning experience for me.
- Dr. DeGuzman opened my eyes on my own history in a way where I felt proud to be who I am and my family's sacrifices for me. The Historical Archive project allowed me to view the everyday household objects in my home in a unique way where I now feel that everything is a part of a larger story that has to do with me. Dr. DeGuzman showed mastery in providing care, compassion, and accessibility to his students with his various links and documents. His relatability with humor and emotion made the content much more engaging and enjoyable to learn.
- Dr. Deguzman had great lectures that were very informative. He did well in incorporating in class discussions and challenged his students through discussions and assignments. He did an excellent job in capturing the Asian American experience in such a short amount of time and he was very communicative with his students.
- Dr. deGuzman really knows how to cater to his students' needs (one-on-one appointments, Q&A documents, etc.) and is very knowledgeable about the course content. As an individual born and raised in Myanmar, I did expect to not see my community as represented as others in the mainstream Asian dialogue so the difficulties of focusing my project on Burmese immigrants in the United States came as no surprise. Regardless, Dr. deGuzman guided me really efficiently by posing questions and clarifying the directions I have available to me. Despite COVID-19 abruptly causing classes to move online, Dr. deGuzman, in my opinion, adapted really well with his diverse slides and guest presentations. His humor is also greatly appreciated. :)
- Dr. deGuzman showed that he truly cared about students' learning and taking away something memorable from the class that will affect their everyday perception of Asian Americans. He takes great care to communicate with students and respond to their questions promptly. Although some guest presentations seem to take time away from lecture, they were very useful in giving personal insight into history and helping students research certain topics.

All in all, I really enjoyed this class and I hope Dr. deGuzman continues to teach with his enthusiasm and passion!

- I really enjoyed taking Asian American 10 with Dr. deGuzman. I appreciate and consider one of Dr. deGuzman's strength to be his passion and compassion for his students. He consistently made himself available to students, which was beneficial for student learning and addressing questions immediately. He was also so flexible, and his passion for Asian American history was apparent, making lectures extremely engaging. I enjoyed the interactive elements such as when students provided answers to make word clouds, Dr. deGuzman showed relevant (and sometimes funny/parody) videos, as well as students sharing about their relevant experiences with the larger class. Having a break halfway through class was another beneficial addition with allowed the content to be broken up and students to stay engaged, due to the long class time. One element that I did not particularly enjoy was when we were put into breakout rooms because people left their cameras off and, sometimes, did not participate. I believe that the workload was very manageable. The readings were also very engaging and relevant to the class material. I enjoyed the assignments as I was able to delve deeper into my family's history, extremely in depth. Overall, this course was extremely engaging. I do not have many critics as I really enjoyed the class and having Dr. deGuzman as an instructor!
- I really enjoyed this course and I thought Dr. DeGuzman did a great job of teaching it. The lectures were generally engaging and Dr. DeGuzman did a good job of teaching it. I appreciated that there was no midterm or final, and I really liked how the archive project allowed us to contribute to the historical record. The one major weakness of this course was that it was sometimes disorganized. There was confusion on the syllabus regarding what readings were required for one of the reading quizzes, some readings dissapeared from CCLE early, and some of our guizzes were not graded or avialable for review long after we took them (although this was due to techincal difficulties). Also, there were additional lectures released online for one topic, and we were never actually told when they would close- one of them closed before the quiz for the lecture content was over. I appreciated that the lectures were available online, but I think it would be nice if they were available for longer, since I sometimes wanted to rewatch certain parts of a lecture. I also think it would have been useful to have them to reference later on for our papers- at the very least, having the Essential Understandings would help with the final paper. I would have liked more discussion opportunities as well. Lastly, I think the pacing of the papers was a little fast, since we had one writing assignment per week for the last few weeks. I realize this may be necessary since summer courses are shorter, but I would have liked a little more time between writing assignments.

- I really like this course though I am taking it as a GE. Before this class, history for me is mere fact to a large extent. But Dr DeGuzman's classes definitely teaches me to dig into what underlies those facts and how to be a historian as a ordinary person. Also, the reading materials are helpful for understanding what was happening in a particular time periods and people's ideologies then, and they are not tedious or boring. And I really like the idea of doing research on a family/community artifact and building a digital archive of this class.
- I thought the classes were incredibly interesting and I really loved the material we covered in lecture and in the reading. I also really appreciated the effort put into being always available. However, I was not a fan of the quizzes that we had on the reading. Sometimes, the answers were incredibly ambiguous or partially correct. There wasn't really a standard to which answer was correct. I knew every question on the quizzes and did all of the readings but I couldn't get 100% on most of them because of how there would be two correct answers. I couldn't tell which one was the right answer, e.g. "Is this answer reading too much into it?" I felt I was penalized for thinking about the material.
- It's going to be very hard to mention something that the professor could do better, because he truly is one of the most excellent professors I've ever had. If I had any criticism to make, though, I would like for the quizzes to require more "thinking", if that makes sense. I understand that they are meant to be relatively easy if you have read the required material and attended lecture, but it would be cool if they would still be easy, but perhaps require some extra investigation. Or perhaps have questions pulled from a broader pool of material. Other than that, this class was incredibly eye opening and instructed by a wonderful professor.
- My instructor's strengths were communication, knolge of the course material, and welcoming personality. I did not see any weaknesses, I honestly liked teh course it was more than I expected since I have never taken an Asian American course before.
- One of the best classes I have taken at UCLA. This is because instead of having a simple, midterm and a final format, Dr. DeGuzman structured his class with a continuous digital archive assignment. This was a much better learning experience than an average structure. Additionally I learned a lot about my ancestors, and the history of my people, which made me understand myself better; especially in the current political climate. As a political science major, it surprised me that I didn't know this portion of America's history. The Professor was extremely accessible, and did a great job explaining everything. I especially liked the Q&A google doc, and I liked that the lectures which were linked in the syllabus were embedded in a course calendar. This helped me stay on top of things, and ensured that I didn't forget anything. The only thing I would change is, I would ask the professor to leave lectures up for the length of the course in case I wanted to rewatch it or better build my understanding. Overall, one of the best courses I've taken, and I would recommend it to all my peers. I can't say enough great things about this course. I wish he taught all my classes.
- Overall the class was at a good pace to follow and none of the assignments or tests were never meant there to trick you. The professor was very available and helpful to any questions or concerns that I had during the course and gave very through instructions when it came to assignments that left very little room for confusion or error. Weaknesses: pacing during class can be a bit slow at times; sometimes we'd have to hold off on discussing topics meant for that lecture b/c we didn't have time; a possible solution to this is to offer some reading guiding questions that can be considered when students are doing their readings so that they know what's important to learn in case we don't get to it during class

- This has been the best course I've taken in the online format for a few reasons. Professor Deguzman kept lectures interesting by encouraging participation from time- to-time and mixed in informative videos and guest speakers rather than simply talking for the duration of class. He implemented an effective system for office hours which I really liked through a sign-up sheet where you can pick a specific time to discuss projects or overall course work and this way there's no line to wait in and it's personal one-on-one interaction. He seemed to really care for our well-being in this era of Covid and was lenient on submission time and very understanding that people are experiencing distinct personal issues right now, and I really appreciated this effort on his part.


